Federal Student Aid

The FSA ID is the way for students and parents to electronically sign the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Your FSA ID is used to confirm your identity when accessing your financial aid information and electronically signing your federal student aid documents. Go to **fsaid.ed.gov** to apply for your Federal Student Aid identification number.

FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Colleges and universities use this form to determine your eligibility for federal, state, and college-sponsored financial aid, including grants, educational loans, and work-study programs. Therefore, even though the FAFSA is technically the application for federal aid, you have to fill it out to receive state and college-sponsored financial aid as well. If you're hoping for any government or school financial aid for college, you should file a FAFSA. Once you have your FSA ID, go to **www.studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa** to learn more and start your application.

Colleges & Universities Visiting Northgate

Meeting with a college representative is a good way to gain information about your interests in a college major and what they can offer you. Colleges, technical school, and the military will be on-site throughout the year setting up lunch table visits. Scholarship Opportunities

WIMMER SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

The Wimmer Scholarship Competition is a general-knowledge exam open to graduating high school seniors who have applied to St. Vincent College. Applicants must submit a high school transcript showing a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher as well as an SAT score of 1080. First place receives full tuition, room, and board. Second through fifth place will receive full tuition. The deadline to register is November 9, 2018, and the competition will take place November 17, 2018.

THE JACK KENT COOKE FOUNDATION COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

To qualify, high school seniors should have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher and a combined, minimum SAT score of 1170 or an ACT minimum composite score of 24.
